Terms of Reference Chapter 11, No. 22 Junior Non-key expert on Project Component 1 – IACS databases for Paying Agency Junior Non-Key Expert

1. Project Background

The overall objective of the project is to improve the capacity of the Ministry of Agriculture, Forestry and Water Management (MAFWM) to manage the process of integration with the EU policies in the agriculture and rural development.

The European Agricultural Fund for Rural Development (EAFRD) and European Agricultural Guarantee Fund (EAGF) constitute the main legislation body of the Common Agricultural Policy could be transposed directly to the candidate countries.

The correct administrative application is crucial for the functioning of the Common Agricultural Policy and the EU internal market. The EU legislation from Chapter 11 may have a significant impact on the current policy support to agriculture in the Republic of Serbia.

Through the implementation of Component 1, this project supports the MAFWM, and other bodies, stakeholders involved in the EU accession process with support in transposition of *acquis* and preparations for implementation of EU Common Agriculture Policy and associated *acquis*. The project shall provide high quality expertise to the EU integration process in the Republic of Serbia for Chapter 11.

The project will have two-fold approach: (1) provide support to coordination and managing the integration process (2) provide technical (content-oriented) support end expertise on demand to the relevant structures in the MAFWM and other institutions.

Component 1. Strengthened capacity to effectively administer and implement alignment of the Serbian agriculture and rural development with the Common Agricultural Policy in the process of EU accession (Chapter 11).

Accession negotiations in Chapter 11 focus amongst others on market organisation, quality policy, organic policy, direct payments and rural development.

Chapter 11 covers a large number of binding rules, many of which are directly applicable.

The proper application of these rules and their effective enforcement and control by an efficient public administration are essential for the functioning of the CAP.

Implementation, management and control of the CAP require the creation, modification and/or strengthening of appropriate administrative structures (e.g. Paying Agency and Integrated Administrative and Control System (IACS)). In some cases, the *acquis* sets out detailed specifications for the required administrative structures.

Through this contract, the Contractor should assist beneficiary in following activities related to Chapter 11 (Agriculture and Rural Development).



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The results forecasted in the project in the current development are the following:

- Result 1.1 Assistance to MAFWM and other relevant stakeholders in preparation for – and in support of accession negotiations pertaining to chapter 11 (Agriculture and Rural Development) provided.
- Result 1.2 Support to the ongoing process of harmonization of national legislation with EU acquis in agriculture and rural development.
- Result 1.3 Institutional and administrative capacity is upgraded and strengthened so as to be fully capable to implement EU acquis on agriculture and rural development by the date of accession.
- Result 1.4 Communication Strategy and Communication Plan for accession negotiation process in Chapter 11 is prepared and implemented, including but not limited to training, development of communication tools and implementation of the awareness campaign.

2. Reference document

3. Terms of Reference Relevance

This mission will be carried out in the framework of the project activities as described in the Terms of Reference, Project Proposal and Implementation plan.

The present assignment will contribute to the achievement of Component 1 by providing expertise and supporting the beneficiary institutions to build up well-functioning process of transposition of EU acquis related to Chapter 11.

4. Assignment objective(s)

In this respect the project needs the support of the expert who will be engaged in the following activities expert's support to and will be engaged in the following Project activities:

Activity 1.1 Supporting Negotiation process for Chapter 11

- Sub Activity 1.1.4 Drafting the Study for the establishment of the Paying Agency

Activity 1.2 Supporting harmonisation with EU acquis for Chapter 11

- Sub Activity 1.2.3 Drafting the Study for the establishment of IACS/LPIS system.
- Sub Activity 1.2.4 Drafting the Study for the establishment of cross compliance controls system

5. Main Tasks

Within the above-mentioned activities the Junior NKE will cooperate with the TL and SNKE, and will implement the following actions:

- Collection of related national legal framework and all available material of existing databases to be used in the establishment of the IACS in Serbia;



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- Supporting the SNKE in the analysis of reports produced by previous projects (in 2018) on existing databases;
- Supporting the SNKE, in the analysis of legal aspects related to existing databases within, or linked with, the Directorate of Agrarian Payments. In particular, the Farm Register, the Animal Identification and Registration, the Land Parcel Identification System;
- Supporting SNKE in the conduction of interviews/surveys with the “owners” of the databases (Veterinary Directorate, Treasury Directorate, etc.) in order to enhance between them and the DAP and to further inform relevant stakeholders about the future individual and joint tasks.
- Supporting the SNKE in the identification of source of data within the existing and new needed databases;
- Analysis of the existing agreement between the Directorate of Agrarian payments and other MAFWM’s Directorates and with other Serbian institutions as the Ministry of Finance;
- Supporting the SNKE in the analysis of the national legal framework (Law on Agriculture and Rural Development – part related to Register of Agricultural Households) and proposal for alignment of the existing Law with EU acquis;
- Supporting the SNKE in the drafting of the Analysis Report, including the proposed new model of Farm Register in line with EU new 2021-2027 CAP requirements and related integration with other IACS databases;
- Supporting the SNKE in the organisation and conduction of a workshop, to present to the Beneficiaries and other stakeholders, the results of the activities;
- Cooperate with TL and SNKE in the implementation of activities mentioned in the ToR.

6. Related Outputs

- Related national legal framework and all available material of existing databases to be used for the establishment of the IACS in Serbia collected;
- SNKE supported, in the analysis of legal aspects related to existing databases within, or linked with, the Directorate of Agrarian Payments;
- SNKE supported in the identification of source of needed data for the improvement of the existing and/or for the design of new needed databases;
- Existing agreements between the Directorate of Agrarian payments and other MAFWM’s Directorates and with other Serbian institutions (e.g. Ministry of Finance) for the exchange of data assessed and Report with recommendations for improvement drafted;
- SNKE supported in the analysis of the national legal framework (Law on Agriculture and Rural Development – part related to Register of Agricultural Households) and in the drafting of proposal for alignment of the existing Law with EU acquis drafted;
- Based on the existing documents produced in 2018, SNKE supported in the drafting of the Analysis Report, including the proposed new model of Farm Register in line with EU new 2021-2027 CAP requirements and related integration with other IACS databases;
- SNKE supported in the organisation and conduction of a workshop to present to the Beneficiaries the results of the activities;
- Cooperation with TL and other NKE IACS experts, in the implementation of activities mentioned in the ToR, ensured.



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7. Timing and duration of mission/s

The assignment shall be implemented in Belgrade, Serbia, in the period October 2020 to July 2021, up to 25 working days. The number of days is subject to extension as needed.

8. Reporting

The expert will deliver monthly reports in the English language on every last workday of the month she/he worked, with attached all written deliverables. The report will be attached to the expert' draft timesheet.
